

Noongar Name: Berrung

Scientific Name: Hakea Petiolaris

Common Name: Sea-urchin Hakea

Leaves: large, spoon shaped, leathery, blue-green with prominent veins

Flowers: creamy purplish clusters resembling sea urchins each containing 120-200 individual flowers

Fruit: woody, egg shaped

Size: Height - 2-9m Width - 1-4m

Location: south Western Australia

Attracts Wildlife: honey eating birds, insects, bees

Usage:

- Source of honey for Noongar people.

Interesting Facts:

- The **Latin** word *petiolaris* means small, slender stalk.
